Lieutenant General Associate Professor Manapon Lekskul, M.D., serves as the Surgeon General of the Royal Thai Army Medical Department and as the Commandant of the Army Medical Field Service School. He earned his M.D. from Phramongkutklao Hospital and College of Medicine, completing residencies in ophthalmology in 1990 and 1995.

Dr. Lekskul specializes in ophthalmology, particularly in cornea and corneal transplantation. He furthered his expertise through fellowship programs at the Schepens Eye Research Institute, Harvard Medical School in Boston, and Wills Eye Hospital in Philadelphia in 1998 and 1999.

Lieutenant General Lekskul is dedicated to advancing corneal transplantation, refractive error correction, and tropical ophthalmic infectious diseases. He shares his knowledge as an expert ophthalmology instructor and consultant at Phramongkutklao Hospital and College of Medicine. Outside of work, he enjoys traveling.

A distinguished alumnus of the Army War College and the National Defence College of Thailand, Lieutenant General Lekskul was previously honored as the command leader of medical cadets and for excellence as a medical cadet in 1988. Within the military, his focus includes missions related to aeromedical evacuation, humanitarian assistance, and disaster relief.
